

Specific Terms & Conditions The William Carey Scholarship The Right Track Scholarship

1. A limited number of scholarships are available. To be considered, the applicant must meet all of the scholarship eligibility criteria.
2. The Scholarship Selection Committee will assess applications, including financial information provided, and advise the percentage of discount to be offered if the application is successful.
3. New students to the College will be interviewed by the Principal (or his delegate) prior to a scholarship offer being made. This interview must be attended by the student and both parents or guardians. Applicants will be advised in writing of the decision regarding their application.
4. Scholarships, when awarded, are provisionally for the balance of the recipient's education at Carey. Acceptance of a scholarship is with the understanding that the student will remain at Carey Baptist College until the end of Year 12.
5. If uniform items from the College Uniform Shop are included in the Scholarship, then a request should be emailed to h.enrolments@carey.wa.edu.au before any purchases are made.
6. Successful applicants and parents/guardians agree to actively support the College's mission, vision and values and uphold the [Student Code of Conduct](#).
7. Successful applicants are required to accept the offered place within 7 days of the offer being made. 'Right Track' and 'William Carey' scholarship recipients are only required to pay a \$50 Enrolment Confirmation fee.
8. The College will not enter into a dispute regarding the awarding of scholarships.
9. All scholarships are conditional upon students maintaining academic and behavioural Good Standing, and school attendance of not less than 90%.
10. While a student may apply for more than one type of scholarship, they can only hold one College scholarship at any given time. Any bursary already in place will be cancelled or renegotiated.
11. Parents and students are informed that it is a condition of the scholarship being awarded that the amount of the scholarship remains confidential between the family and the College.
12. The College will review all scholarships annually with respect to:
 - The ongoing financial situation of the family
 - Satisfactory compliance with payment of College fees and levies
 - The recipient maintaining academic and behavioural Good Standing
 - The recipient maintaining an attendance rate of not less than 90%
 - Participation and service within the Carey Community
13. All information collected will be treated in accordance with the National Privacy Principles (NPP) contained in the Privacy Act 1998 (Cth) and with the Carey Baptist College Limited Privacy policy.
