Dear Parents and Caregivers,

It has been a wonderful return to school for Term 2 with about 80% of our student population onsite in classrooms. About 13% of our students are learning from home, with many of these planning to be back on site next week.

From Week 3 (next Monday), we are going to move from online teaching and learning to face-to-face classroom-based teaching.

Families still have a choice about sending children to school, but our offerings for learning at home will need to change. It is not possible for teachers to provide two different modes of learning when they are face-to-face teaching with children all day.

During Week 3, your child's teachers will be in contact with you regarding provision of learning materials for those students learning from home.

Families will still be able to contact the teacher with questions about the programs and activities, and we expect that staff will connect with children learning at home at least once a week.

To the families who have chosen to send their children to school physically, thank you for the way you have respected our restrictions around being onsite and maintaining good hand hygiene. We all want to keep our children, our staff, ourselves and our community safe during this time.

In Philippians 4:6-7, we are reminded that God is in control:

“Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.”

Our staff are firmly holding on to the promise of peace in these verses; please be encouraged to do so as well however your family is faring at the moment. We will continue to pray for the health and wellbeing of you all throughout this time.
