Our College has two campuses – Harrisdale and Forrestdale. They are well-known for holistic education, together with their passionate local communities.

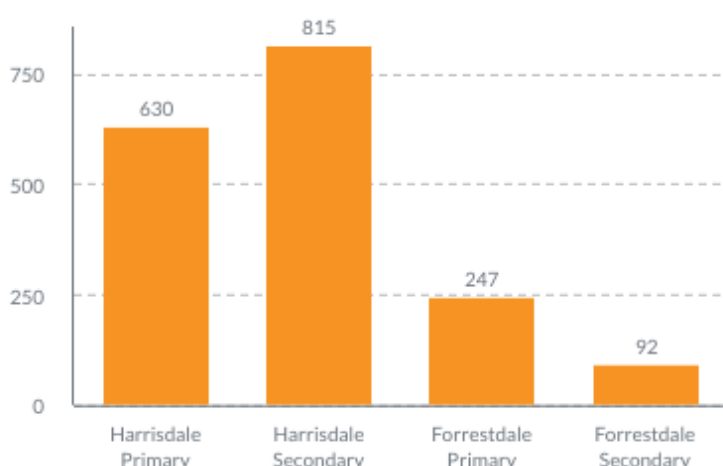
Our founding campus, Carey Harrisdale, provides education from Kindergarten to Year 12. Over the past 20 years, Harrisdale has grown to educate approximately 1,430 students every year and has consistently achieved exceptional educational outcomes.

Our second campus, Carey Forrestdale, was established in 2016 and in 2020 we had 340 students from Kindergarten to Year 8. Carey Forrestdale will continue to grow each year to eventually offer Kindergarten to Year 12 by 2024.

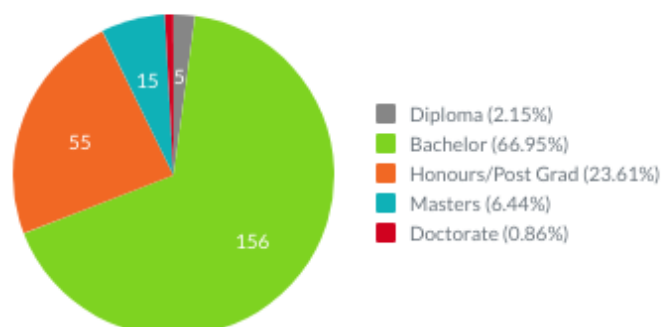
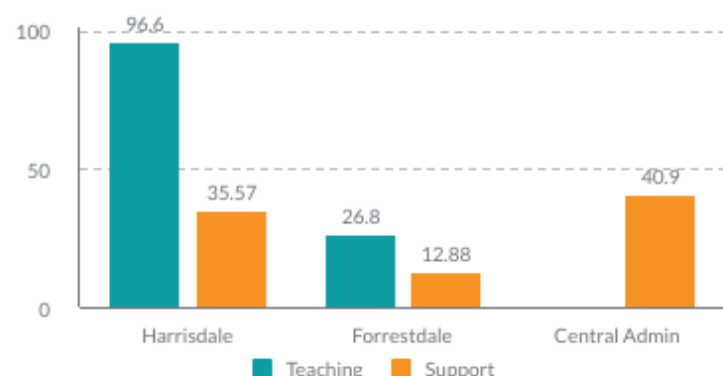
Carey Baptist College has a range of procedures to manage attendance. Attendance is measured twice a day in Primary School and in every session in Secondary School. Forrestdale Focus

The Forrestdale campus embraces the bushland and outdoor areas to enhance student learning — an innovative approach to educating students. All College classrooms and indoor learning spaces are air-conditioned.

Primary and Secondary Facilities Include:

- A state-of-the-art Community Hub that includes an auditorium and a café kiosk for our families and community. The Community Hub also includes Primary classrooms and breakout learning spaces for both Primary and Secondary.
- Purpose built Kindergarten and Pre-Primary classrooms with built-in toilets and large fenced outdoor play spaces.
- Horticultural area.
- Large Primary classrooms.
- Large ovals and play areas.
- Outdoor learning spaces, including an amphitheatre.
- Multi-purpose outdoor court facility for basketball, netball, tennis and volleyball.
- Community Vegetable Garden.

The campus is also home to Carey Baptist Church Forrestdale and Jump Out of School Hours Care.



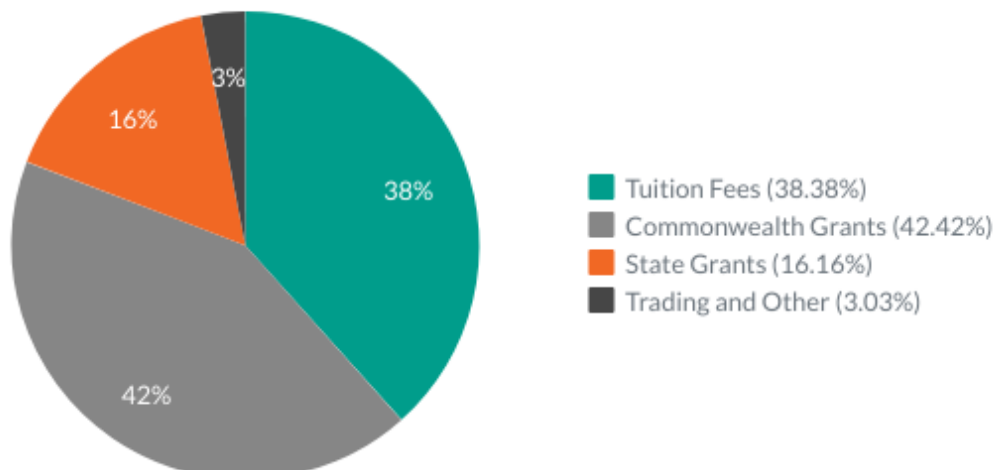

Funding Sources

Carey Baptist College receives funding from a variety of sources including parents, government funding and capital grants for new development. For both Harrisdale and Forrestdale the majority of our funding comes from State and Federal funding based on a calculation which takes into account actual parent incomes and the number of students.





Harrisdale Focus

The Harrisdale Campus was established in 1998 and has since grown into a leading co-educational Christian school in Perth's south-east, offering education from Kindergarten to Year 12. Carey Harrisdale educates over 1,450 students on 12 hectares of land and is well-known for its holistic education and passionate local community.

Primary and Secondary Joint Facilities Include:

- Teasdale iCentre: Our state-of-the-art Teasdale iCentre and library is the hub of the Campus. Kindergarten through to Year 12 access this facility and engage with its resources and staff. The iCentre provides a social space to meet, collaborate, research, learn, share, and relax.
- College Auditorium: Seating up to 1,000 people, our auditorium hosts assemblies and major events and is also home to Carey Baptist Church Harrisdale.
- All College classrooms and indoor learning spaces are air-conditioned.

The campus is also home to Carey Baptist Church Harrisdale, Timber Café and Jump Carey Early Development.

Primary School Facilities Include:

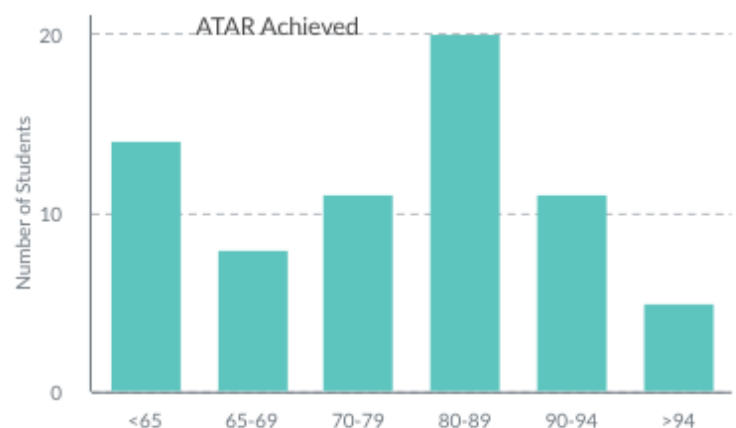
- Purpose built Kindergarten and Pre-Primary classrooms with built-in toilets and large fenced outdoor play spaces.
- A large Primary Art Room, Music Room, LOTE rooms, and Curriculum Support classrooms.
- A full-sized oval, large playground, cubby-fort area, and undercover play space.
- The Carey Community Garden.
- FlatChat on-site Speech Therapy.

Secondary School Facilities Include:

- Core-Curriculum and elective dedicated classrooms and studios.
- A large purpose-built Science Centre with a lab technician space and courtyard.
- A two-storey Arts Centre with Woodwork, Metalwork, Music classrooms, and practise spaces.
- An expansive Health and Physical Education building that includes a gymnasium, changerooms, fitness centre, and indoor courts.

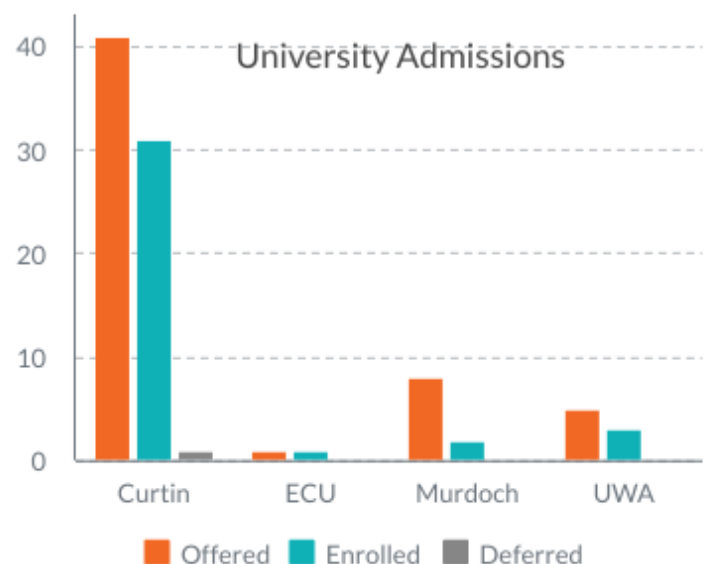

Y12 Student Feedback 2020

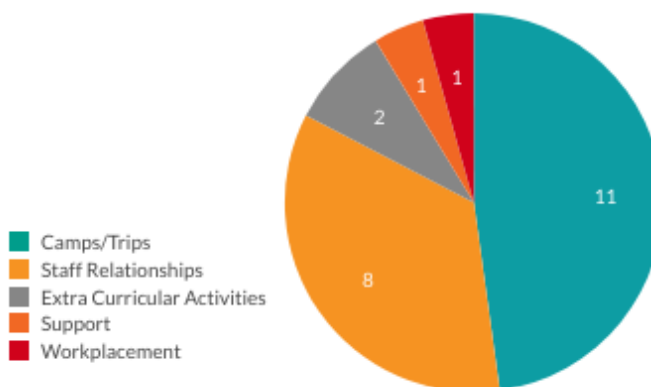
At the end of each year, our Secondary Principal, Mr Brenden Gifford meets with small groups of Year 12 students. Their feedback is an important part of our review process.

- Changes to uniform



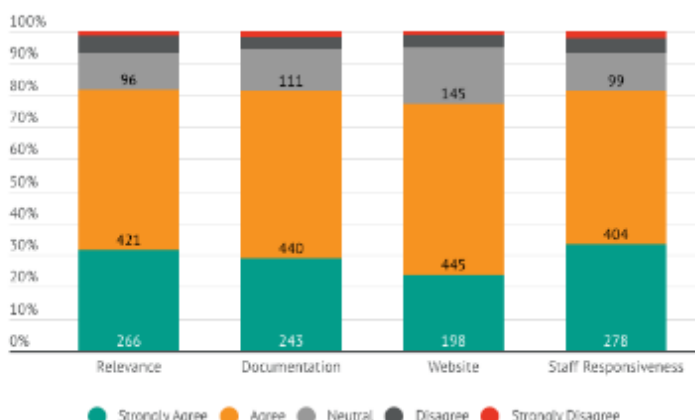
What our Students said they Valued Most



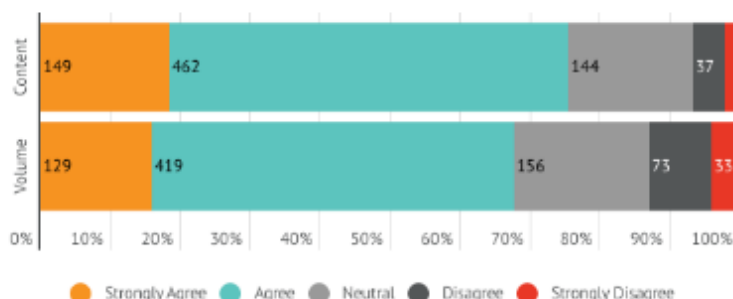
Parent Survey

We recently asked parents what they thought on a number of topics. We sent the survey to 2348 people representing 1090 families. We received 840 responses. Here are some of the results.
