Our founding campus, Carey Harrisdale, provides education from Kindergarten to Year 12. Over the past 20 years, Harrisdale has grown to educate over


1,500 students every year and has consistently achieved exceptional educational outcomes.








## Staff Information

Qualifications of Teaching Staff






## Funding Sources

Carey Baptist College receives funding from a variety of sources including parents, government funding and capital grants for new development.

For both Harrisdale and Forrestdale the majority of our funding comes from State and Federal funding based on a calculation which takes into account actual parent incomes and the number of students.



## Forrestdale Focus

Our Forrestdale campus embraces all the benefits of the local environment to enhance student learning. Utilising the outdoor areas and wonderful bushlands surrounding the campus, students learn both within the classroom and in the outdoors.

Nature pedagogy is a feature with all students having the opportunity to learn from the local environment, as they explore themes of sustainability and first nations learning. This is further enhanced by a rich Outdoor education and and Camps program, where students are encouraged to grow in skills and independence, connect to the environment and learn in an experiential manner.

The college has a central community Hub which includes a café for the Carey Forrestdale families. Meeting together encourages a rich sense of community and connection beyond the usual school drop off and pick up. The primary classrooms are vibrant spaces: large and adaptable for any learning mode, including opportunities to work across rooms and into breakout spaces.

The purpose built Kindergarten and Pre-Primary enjoy large fenced areas and amenities within the designated learning area.

Other features of the Forrestdale campus are horticulture areas, large ovals, basketball courts and a fast developing capital development program. A new STEM building has been under construction for 2021, ready to host woodwork, metalwork, engineering, robotics and design from 2022.

Forrestdale campus hosts Jump Out of Hours Care, a great support to our families. Carey Baptist Church Forrestdale also calls the campus home, and provides support and connection for our community.

What you will notice upon entering the Forrestdale campus is evidence of its 'heart': a passion for environmental learning and sustainability, a warm and welcoming community and a real drive to offer the very best to it's families.

Carey Forrestdale is a school of choice for a fast-growing number of families due to its reputation for care, excellence in education and facilities that provide significant opportunities for students to develop and grow.



The Harrisdale Campus was established in 1998 and has since grown into a leading co-educational Christian school in Perth's south-east, offering education from Kindergarten to Year 6. Carey Harrisdale educates over 1,450 students on 12 hectares of land and is well-known for its holistic education and passionate local community.

Carey Harrisdale seeks to provide a range of services to families that are not just limited to the educational offerings of the College. Jump Early Development Services offer long day care, access to a health nurse and OSHC; Flat Chat Speech Therapy offers services to Jump and Carey Primary students; Carey Church operates out of the Auditorium; and Timber Cafe not only delivers beautiful food and coffee, it provides opportunities for our community to connect.

Carey is well renowned for its exceptional Music program. It offers many opportunities for students who are passionate about sports, dance, cheerleading, and the arts.

Carey provides gifted and talented programs in Primary School, with opportunities for students to apply for scholarships in Year 7. We also run special programs for students who need support in their learning.

Carey Primary has a fantastic garden and state of the art aviary - the only one of its kind in WA. A new Undercover Area is currently being built that will accommodate a full sized basketball court where netball and other games can be played.

Carey is also known for its heart of compassion and its commitment to social justice. Carey Harrisdale supports two orphanages and a school in Bali; Right Track runs training programs in remote communities and at the juvenile detention centre; and other projects help our local community as well as overseas.

Carey is a school of choice for many families due to its exceptional pastoral care, excellence in education and wonderful facilities that provide significant opportunities for students to develop and grow.



Carey Baptist College has a reputation for academic achievement, positive pastoral care and a rich diversity of co-curricular activities. Our reputation reflects a commitment to providing the best all-around education for our students by challenging them in their intellectual, emotional, physical, social and spiritual development.

Secondary learning occurs within a faith-based values system that encourages students to become independent, creative and flexible learners. This, together with a strong sense of responsibility to their community, reflects the best traditions of an independent Baptist education.

In encouraging our students to develop their potential, we place a major emphasis on supportive teaching and learning environments, both within and beyond the classroom. This includes an inclusive House System that encourages engagement and belonging for all students in Years 7-12. Our House system is named and based on the six seasons in the Whajuk Noongar calendar, and it incorporates sport, service, competition and leadership development.

At an academic level, Carey competes nationally and often internationally in Physics, Chemistry, STEM and in Engineering challenges. These competitions allow our students to engage with the best students and academic programs in Australia.

Carey also offers a broad diversity of learning opportunities for students providing a wide diversity of elective subjects for students, including recognised specialist programs in Music, Japanese, Aviation, Basketball, Soccer and Cheer. Students are also encouraged to join school-based extracurricular clubs involving Equestrian, Table Tennis, The Bibbulmun Track, Drama, Art, Human Powered Vehicle Racing and Fitness.

Service learning is also a feature of a Carey Education with programs available to students in South East Asia (Cambodia and Indonesia), wildlife conservation, the Ningaloo Reef, Reconciliation, land care and first aid.


Carey Secondary is a safe, rigorous, engaging learning community of over 800 Secondary students, with a tradition of graduating exceptional young men and women of character and capacity.



## 2021 Certificate Qualifications




## 2021 NAPLAN completion results


