Carey is committed to supporting teachers who are hopeful, compassionate and inspired to make a difference in the world, people who are committed to both personal and professional excellence.

Education students currently studying for an education degree at either Master's, Bachelor's or Graduate Diploma level are invited to apply for a Carey Teacher Education Scholarship.

The Carey Teacher Education Scholarship has been established to offer education students a unique opportunity to gain experience in an open enrolment Christian School.

Scholarships are awarded to students with an excellent academic record who are enthusiastic about contributing to the curricular and co-curricular life of Carey Baptist College.

## Our Values

## Benefits to the Recipient

- For **Master's** degree recipients, the Scholarship is valued at \$1000 per annum for up to 2 years, paid in two equal installments after university exams.
- For **Bachelor's** degree recipients, the Scholarship is valued at \$1000 per annum for up to 3 years, paid in two equal installments after university exams.
- For **Graduate Diploma in Education** recipients, the scholarship is valued at \$1000, paid in two equal installments after university exams.
- Recipients will be paired with an experienced teacher mentor.
- Recipients will be invited to participate in regular College Professional Learning.
- Sponsorship to attend Professional Learning through CSA, Avenir Leadership Institute, Morling College and other approved professional teaching organisations.
- Paid work (as qualified) on camps and excursions as a Non-Teaching Staff member.
- Paid work (as qualified) while completing studies as a Limited Authority teacher.
- Access to a Professional experience placement at Carey College (subject to University policy).
- These scholarships are not bonded. Recipients have no ongoing obligation to Carey Baptist College post-graduation and are not guaranteed future employment.

## Eligibility

This Scholarship is offered subject to:

- Applicants currently enrolled to study full-time or part-time with a recognised West Australian university studying:
  - Master of Teaching (Secondary)
  - Bachelor of Education (Secondary)
  - Graduate Diploma in Education (Secondary)
- Applicants currently enrolled in an eligible degree must maintain a weighted average mark (WAM) of at least 70 across each year of study.

## Selection Criteria

Teaching Scholarships will be awarded based on the following:

- Academic marks (first and second semester) and professional experience (including practicum reports)
- Engagement in church and/or community service and leadership
- A one-page statement explaining why you would like to be the recipient of a teacher-training scholarship at an independent Christian school
- An interview
- Scholarships will be awarded by the Director of Education in consultation with College Principals.

## Application Process

Enrolled students can apply in Term 4, addressing the selection criteria above.

Successful applicants will be notified in December for the following year.

## Ongoing Eligibility

To continue receipt of the Scholarship, the recipient must achieve satisfactory progress in their professional experience placements whilst continuing to meet the spirit of the selection criteria above. Scholarships are reviewed annually.

## Termination

The Scholarship will be terminated if the recipient:

- Does not maintain satisfactory academic performance (as defined under eligibility)
- Engages in unprofessional conduct (see *College Code of Conduct*)
- Is unable to maintain Working with Children accreditation
- Does not engage in prescribed professional learning activities
- Withdraws or defers from their education degree
- Fails to uphold the ethos and values of Carey Baptist College.

## Privacy

The recipient agrees to provide the College with their personal information, including academic progress, as appropriate, in connection with this Scholarship. This includes:

- Academic transcripts (each Semester/Year) of units completed and grades
- Professional Experience Placement Reports.
